FLU SEASON/SICK POLICY

Due to the expected severity of the flu season this year, PCR has implemented a few policies to help prevent the spread of the flu virus at PCR programs. Hand sanitizer will be available at all PCR programs, and hand washing is encouraged before and after all programs. In addition, all program participants will be asked to wash their hands after coughing or sneezing.

Any member who arrives at a PCR program exhibiting flu-like symptoms will be asked not to attend the program until their symptoms have subsided. This measure will help to keep all members healthy, and is especially important for our members who are more susceptible to the flu. PCR staff and contractors have also been made aware of these policies, and will follow them.

Please remember that PCR follows Montgomery County Public School closings during bad weather. If MCPS is closed, closes early, or cancels evening activities, PCR will not hold programs that evening. For Sunday programs, including basketball and respite programs, a decision will be made based on road conditions and the safety of our members. Members will be notified by phone of any cancellation that occur on a Sunday.
